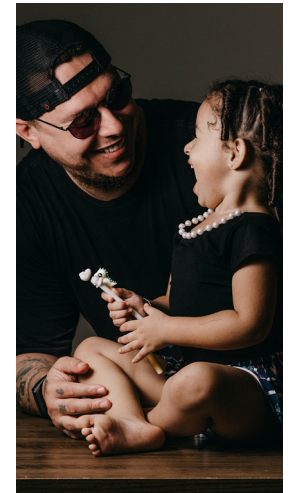

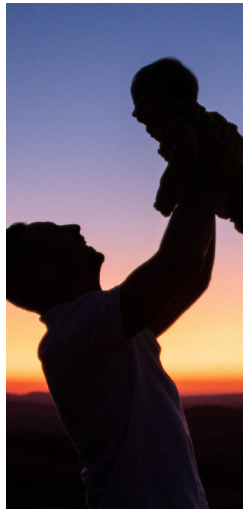

WHY THE FATHERHOOD PROGRAM?

- Father\partner involvement decreases maternal and infant mortality rates.
- When a father\partner is invested and present, risk indicators related to mental health decrease significantly.
- Effective fatherhood\partnership increases reading and academic performance, and helps prevent or decrease the development of learning disabilities.
- Children who grow up with a father figure develop better human relationships, and healthier emotional responses.
