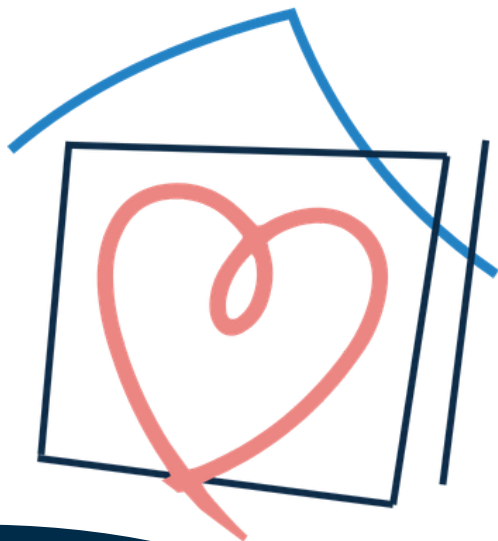

What is Home Visiting?

Healthy Babies Home Visiting is an educational program that provides prenatal, postpartum, and parenting support to women and families in Sedgwick County. Registered nurses and community liaisons visit you to provide education, family support, and connections to local resources.

Depending on your eligibility, services may continue until the child reaches age 2.

How does Home Visiting work?

Visits take place either in your home or at the Healthy Babies office and typically last about one hour. Your individual needs and your specific program eligibility determine how often we meet.

What does a Home Visitor do?

A home visitor is a nurse, community liaison, or community health worker who:

- Shares parenting and health information
- Assesses family needs
- Connects families to services
- Offers caring support



Home Visitors provide confidential, judgment-free information and resources about:

- Healthy pregnancy
- Labor and delivery
- Maternal warning signs
- Safe sleep
- Car seat safety
- Breastfeeding
- Family planning
- Infant health, growth, and development

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
